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Ruckel Middle School Chorus Policies and Procedures

I. Attendance Policy

The chorus calendar is available in this handbook as well as through the Google Calendar link on the Ruckel Chorus website. [Ramchorus.weebly.com] Students are expected to attend performances as outlined below:

6th **grade:** Fall/Holiday and Spring concerts, as well as the adjudicated Music Performance Assessment (MPA). Two to four after school rehearsal will be scheduled to combine the two sixth grade classes before major performances. These will be highly encouraged.

Envoys/Ambassadors: Fall/Holiday and Spring concerts, as well as the adjudicated Music Performance Assessment (MPA). Additionally, the Ruckel Veteran's Day ceremony, and Twin Cities Honor Choir Community Performance are mandatory for these groups. As per the contract, there may be additional performances for these auditioned groups.

Chanson Chorus: Fall/Holiday and Spring concerts, as well as the adjudicated Music Performance Assessment (MPA).

Any student who has an <u>unexcused</u> absence from a performance will receive a grade of zero for that performance. Every student is integral to the performance of the entire group.

<u>Excused</u> absences include death in the family or personal illness with a doctor's note. Any other situation requires notice prior to the absence and must be excused by the director.

When conflicts occur, school activities must take precedence over non-school activities. If a student is involved in more than one school activity, the faculty members in charge will help the parents and students work out an acceptable solution.

A performance takes precedence over a non-school event or practice.

II. Grading

All grades will be based on the following five categories and posted on gradebook:

- Daily assessment (including participation)
- Performance attendance and assessment, based on the FL state standards.
- Written skills tests
- Music vocabulary tests
- Vocal assessments

III. Chorus Communication

The Ruckel Chorus uses email and remind text messages for communication. If you signed up last year, you will need to do it again.

IV. Classroom Procedures

The following procedures ensure a safe and productive rehearsal environment:

- Folders and pencil out after the tardy bell, put away materials at the end of class.
- Be in assigned location
- Stay focused during warmups and rehearsal
- Participate as directed
- No touching others
- No talking back to the teacher
- The piano is off-limits to students unless prior approval has been given. No gum, food, or drink is allowed in the chorus room (except water).

Consequences for not following classroom procedures:

- Warning
- Student/Teacher conference
- Action plan with parent contact
- Office referral

V. Uniforms TBD

VI. Curriculum

The chorus curriculum for all chorus classes at Ruckel is based on the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards. These standards are in line with the Common Core Standards. Students will be graded daily, as well as during performances. Learning target skills include:

- Demonstrates correct tone and pitch placement
- Demonstrates correct posture, breath support, and control
- Demonstrates correct vowel formation
- Demonstrates both head and chest voice
- Sings with steady beat
- Demonstrates awareness of internal pulse
- Reads notes on the staff in appropriate clefs
- Demonstrates the ability to sing a major scale
- Identifies and describes musical elements specific to music rehearsed and performed
- Consistently demonstrates musician-specific behaviors in all rehearsal and performance settings. These include: focused attention, positive contribution to the ensemble, positive attitude
- Makes value judgments regarding music and music performance based on specific criteria. These include: rhythm, melody, harmony, tone color, expressive elements, style
- Examines composer intent and origin in relation to specific repertoire
- Performs note and rest values of whole notes through sixteenth and dotted rhythms.
- Critiques, using correct music vocabulary, changes in one's own or others' musical performance resulting from practice or rehearsal

- Discuss how music relates to the world outside of the music classroom
- Discuss how technology has changed the way we consume and perform music
- Demonstrates ability to determine scale solfege placement based on knowledge of major and/or minor key signatures.
